California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015 Report: County Operated Schools and Programs (COSP) Director Lauren Dinubilo presented the California Mathematics Placement Act report related to COSP court and community schools. She reported there was a total of 136 ninth-grade students who, within the first 30 school days, were re-evaluated through a math placement check.

Of those students, 64 were enrolled in Integrated Math 1A and 71 in Algebra A. Ms. Dinubilo explained that these classes are the first of two, 10-credit courses that satisfy the Math and Algebra 1 requirements for high school graduation once completed. She went on to say that one student was placed in the Integrated Math 1 course, which is a more advanced course. She indicated that no teachers reported an inappropriate placement and that the assessment data shows that the student mathematic placement is appropriate and confirms that no students were held back in a disproportionate manner.
