I. CALL TO ORDER:

Vice-President Gebhardt called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. Board member Vogel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- II. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA: There were no additions to the agenda.
- III. COMMENTS: There were no comments from the audience.

IV. ITEMS SCHEDULED FOR INFORMATION:

- Credential Application Annual Report: Director of Human Resources Christina Torres-Peters reviewed the annual Credential Application Report that illustrates the number of credential applications processed by the San Joaquin County Office of Education during the 2020 – 2021 school year, including temporary teaching certificate applications. Ms. Torres-Peters reported that a total of 281 credential applications were processed, 18 of which were renewal applications. In terms of temporary county certificates, a total of 595 applications were processed, which included 62 for San Joaquin County Office of Education employees.
- Declaration of Need: Director of Human Resources Christina Torres-Peters presented the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators report and explained that actual needs and projected enrollment for the coming year indicate the area of anticipated need for emergency permits includes CLAD and English Learn Authorization in the San Joaquim County Alternative Education and Special Education programs. The estimated number of limited assignment permits includes 5 multiple subject credentials, 30 single subject credentials, and 10 credentials in the area of special education.

Participation in a commission-approved university internship program, as well as programs provided by Teachers College of San Joaquin, serve as evidence of efforts to certify, assign, and develop fully qualified teaching staff. County Superintendent Mousalimas certified this report, which will remain in effect until June 30, 2022.

3. Summary of Support for Districts: Assistant Superintendent Jane Steinkamp introduced the new Director of Continuous Improvement and Support Connor Sloan who presented

the San Joaquin County Office of Education Summary Report for 2021 – 2022. Dr. Sloan explained that this report outlines the plan to support the implementation and approval of Local Control and Accountability Plans, as well as the utilization of the cycle of continuous improvement to provide technical assistance based on need that adhere to the provisions of Education Code §§ 52066 and 52071. Dr. Sloan reviewed the objectives, indicators, and actions that would provide these services, along with the collaboration efforts and the budget that support the plan. He said that the plan focuses on school district priorities and tailors district needs identified through student data to increase academic growth for all students, in essence connecting districts with the right resources at the right time.

Board members asked questions regarding the overall continued use of distance learning, and whether the emotional well-being of all students is considered during the process, including those who may experience trigger trauma.

4. Local Indicator Report: Division Director Sean Morrill reviewed the San Joaquin County Office of Education Local Indicator Report. Mr. Morrill described the priorities based on performance standards which includes an analysis of the level of appropriately assigned teachers, access to curriculum-aligned instructional materials, and safe, clean and functional school facilities; the progress on the implementation of State Academic Standards; the inclusion of input from parents in decision-making and the promotion of parental participation in programs; the analysis of the school climate, which includes the perception of school safety and connectedness; a review of the extent of student access and enrollment in a broad course of study; an assessment of the level of progress in the coordination of instruction for expelled students; and the coordination of services for Foster Youth. Mr. Morrill explained that College and Career Readiness data is provided through CalPADS and although offered to students, many do not stay in the program long enough to complete a pathway.
